S - Scriptures

“LORD, who may dwell in your sacred tent? Who may live on your holy mountain?” Psalm 15:1

C - Consideration

David, probably looking at the Tabernacle and its place, asked the two questions above. He showed in both inquires, God’s holiness and the problem of sin among the contestants. In the next verses, he placed a list to be followed by the possible candidates. The qualities reminded him of Noah and Job’s characters: they were “righteous, and blameless. They both feared God and they shunned evil. David seemed to detail their actions: They spoke the truth from their hearts, honored God’s people, kept their word even when it hurt, lived with integrity, and were generous to the poor. In Genesis chapter six, it is added that Noah walked with God”.

C – Commitment

According to the Scriptures, there is no one who is right, not even one. We all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. The Scriptures called David, a man after God’s heart. He loved God and was the greatest example of a true worshiper in the Bible. Yet, he had murdered an innocent man and committed adultery. How anyone could fulfill the law’s requirement? Noah and Job were not perfect either. God himself intervened on our behalf, sending Jesus to solve the dilemma. He was the perfect one, who came from the heavenly Tabernacles to die on the cross and to pay Noah’s, Job’s, David’s, and the sins of us all. Therefore, once a sinner repents and receives Christ in his heart, he no longer dwells in a tabernacle neither goes into the mountain to meet God, but he becomes God’s tabernacle. The presence of the Holy Spirit in the heart of a believer sanctify his life; therefore, he loves God, and does the things that please God, and never is shaken.”

C – Call

My God, You are holy and You call me to walk in holiness. I could never fulfill the requirements of Your law to dwell in Your presence. But, because of Your mercy and love, You sent Your Son to forgive my sins, You sent the Holy Spirit to sanctify my soul. Lord, how can I be grateful enough for what You had done?
